mtn celebrates twenty-five years

On September 19, MTN celebrated its 25th birthday at **Babalu Restaurant** in the warehouse district. Over 200 people attended this night of fun, to eat, meet, greet and be amused and entertained by MTN stars and some great music acts.

The host for the evening was **Ian Rans** of **Drinking With Ian**. He handed out door prizes to randomly selected party-goers and introduced such special guests as **Viva and Jerry**, poet **Karma the Oddest Goddess**, and the Best Looking Man in comedy, **Fancy Ray McCloney**. Other speakers included MTN Board Members **Marido Huber**, **Tom Cassidy** and **Edie French**, MTN Executive Director **Pam Colby**, and City Council Members **Robert Lilligren**, **Ralph Remington** and **Diane Hofstede**.

He enjoys his work with the MTN staff, but because he works in the upstairs administrative office, he hasn't met many of the producers who make shows at MTN. But he did enjoy meeting the people he met at the MTN 25th Anniversary Celebration. And although he doesn't have any idea for a show that he might make himself, he would be willing to help somebody else out on their video production.

access to art marks 17th episode

It's time for a new episode of Access to Art!

Starting December 9, join us for our lucky 17th episode Tuesdays at 8:30 PM on MTN 17 or online at mtn.org/accesstoart. In this episode, host **Tom Cassidy** visits the the **Susan Hensel Gallery** for the opening reception of their current show Leap of Faith, which runs through December 28. Here's a peek at our other featured groups.



Segment 1: The **Minnesota Center for Book Arts** is a hub of all things related to bookmaking. Among other things, they offer classes, host events and exhibit works by local artists. One important service they offer to local artists is the Artist Cooperative whose members gain access to the equipment in MCBA's papermaking, bookbinding and printing studios. Access to Art



Correspondent **Beth Peloff** visited the studio to watch some of these artists in action.

Segment 2: **Art Space** is a non-profit real estate developer that creates affordable live-work spaces for artists. Coming out of the artistic renaissance of the Minneapolis Warehouse District in the 1970's, Art Space was created in 1979 as an advocacy organization for the space needs of artists. Now Art Space works with artists all over the country as a property developer and consultant. Access to Art Correspondent **Ashley Siebels** talked to some of the people behind Art Space and visited some of their local projects.

Segment 3: Founded in 1986 by choreographer **Myron Johnson**, the **Ballet of the Dolls** is a dance-theater company housed in the Ritz Theater in Northeast Minneapolis. Their performances, which feature elements of dance and theater, include original works and deconstructions of traditional ballets such as the Nutcracker. Access to Art Correspondent **Laura Stopyro** attended their most recent show, an original production titled "Born to Be Alive."
